Do no harm, produce valid results,
reach beyond academia

“Do no harm” to whom, how, when:
Reflexive ethical practice and/or
resolution from the ethical committee

**Empathic and empowering
methodology for collecting stories:
Solutions that are built in at every stage**

Archiving, access, and publication:
Imagining possible consequences
(eps. if the situation radically changes)
